Ryan Elementary School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for Ryan Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Ryan Elementary has several challenges. The school has a number of students that struggle with reading skills that are necessary for both current and future educational success. The school will continue using a Response to Instruction model to close achievement gaps and promote learning in all students. Academically, the school has had more success in Math than in other subjects. A new Title 1 model was implemented in the fall of 2013 with certified ELA and Math teachers that assist struggling learners. The school will continue using a multi-tiered support system for students that are not meeting grade level benchmarks.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

For Bronson Community Schools, there are three K-12 buildings. Students in grades K-2 are assigned to Anderson Elementary. Students in grades 3-5 are assigned to Ryan Elementary and students in grades 6-12 are assigned to the Bronson Jr/Sr High School building.

Annually, the school improvement plan is updated to reflect any changes, with a vision of where we need to be. With the change to a new assessment system, our district is updating school improvement plans to incorporate the increased rigor expectations, with a goal to be above the state averages in all content areas 4 years from now.

The district has a curriculum warehouse called Curriculum Crafter where the district curriculum is housed. The state has a set of K-12 expectations that outline the knowledge and skills students need in English language arts and math and, in 2015-2016, science standards were approved as well. Social studies are in development for Michigan. As state standards are updated and approved, districts work to update curriculum standards at the local level, including the development of a scope and sequence, lessons, and local assessments to measure progress. After these updates are vetted and approved at a district level, the curriculum maps are updated to reflect changes. The MAISA Common Core Units found on the Michigan Common Core Resources website, provides a model curriculum. Our standard targets align with the embedded curriculum standards, with variance on lesson presentation and instructional practices.
