3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL- We the Bronson district do not currently have any specialized schools. Ryan Elementary does have a site based BISD emotional impaired classroom.

IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION, AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL- Bronson Community Schools follows the state guidelines for curriculum and utilizes tools like the MAISA, Common Core in math and ELA, and the Michigan Merit Curriculum. Teachers teach to a Standards Based Report Card

and use formative and summative assessment to adjust instruction in Tier 1, 2, and 3.
